

Thailand has hovered between ranks 110–130 for much of the past decade, showing occasional progress but lacking the consistency to maintain a top-100 position.

However, with steady performances in regional tournaments like the ASEAN Football Federation (AFF) Championship and World Cup qualifiers, the team has demonstrated notable growth.





Thailand's return to the FIFA top 100 is its first since March 2010, marking a symbolic milestone and reflecting significant improvements in footballing standards over the past decade.






## Teerasil Dangda
